The President's Perspective



ikola Tesla was one of the greatest inventors of a century ago. Everyday, Americans benefit from his breakthrough research in AC electricity and wireless communication.

In 1895, as Mr. Tesla was reaching the apex of his fame, a devastating fire destroyed his laboratory. His uninsured loss topped \$250,000 (over 7 million dollars today). Besides all the equipment, his volumes of research files were also destroyed.

Not willing to quit, Nickola Tesla continued his work at the laboratory of Thomas Edison while he began to rebuild. Friends and businesses encouraged the

inventor to get back on his feet by offering credit. Mr. Tesla responded with one such letter as he ordered vital equipment, "I shall rely, as to the price, entirely on the fairness of the Westinghouse Company. I believe that there are gentleman in that company who believe in a hereafter." (Seifer, Marc. *Wizard* - Biography. New York: Citadel Press. 1998. p. 148).

Nikola Tesla was the son of a Serbian, orthodox priest. His statement is powerful. Believing that we will one day give an account for our deeds is a somber thought, and the Bible clearly reveals that as fact (Gal. 6:7,8, II Cor. 5:10).


Now a hundred years later, I wonder how many Christians really believe that individuals do stand accountable?
