The President's Perspective



A few months ago, I ended a lively family discussion with... "son, you don't have to fight every battle. You need to choose your fights." After attempting to impart this wisdom, my mind remembered an illustration from the past.

Born April 19, 1922, Erich Hartmann became the greatest fighter pilot in the world. Before WWII was over, Germany's Major Erich Hartmann would shoot down 352 enemy airplanes.

In his 1405 combat

missions, Hartmann was never injured or shot down by an opposing aircraft. As a trainer of future pilots, he never had a wingman captured or injured, a feat that he was more proud of than his personal exploits. What was even more amazing was that Hartmann came into his own as a young fighter pilot in the spring of 1943, a time that the German war effort was in decline. Fighting mostly on the Russian front, Hartmann's squadron moved 37 times during 1943 – 1945, as the Russians pushed the Germans back in retreat.

How did pilot Erich Hartmann succeed and survive? Early on as a fighter pilot, this young 21 yearold pilot had a battle plan. In his autobiography, Hartmann revealed that whenever a battle presented itself

he talked himself through these four segments "See – Decide – Attack – Reverse, or 'Coffee Break."

Hartmann would not fight every battle. Out of over 1400 missions, he only got in 825 dogfights, shooting down less than half of the combatants.

No one will probably ever match the young, blonde ace's accomplishment... a record that was made by choosing which battles to fight. (Toliver, Raymond and Constable, Trevor. *The Blond Knight of Germany*. New York: Doubleday, 1970. p. 61.)
